Southern Rhode Island Conservation District and the Town of Westerly host walking tour and design sessions for Main Street Resilient Riverfront Renewal Project

WESTERLY, Rhode Island, May 23, 2024 – The Southern Rhode Island Conservation District and the Town of Westerly will host three sessions to provide key stakeholders including elected and town officials, business and property owners and community organizations and individuals an opportunity to provide input on the design concepts for the next phase of the Main Street Resilient Riverfront Renewal Project along the Pawcatuck River. All sessions are open to the general public.

The sessions will be conducted by Fuss & O'Neill engineering, who in an earlier phase of the project, assessed the stormwater needs and evaluated the traffic on Main Street. This data fueled the design for improvements to mitigate stormwater and improve the experience along Main Street for seven parcels in the corridor.

The next phase of the project is to gather input to help develop a design that will integrate a variety of green infrastructure features along Main Street to reduce flooding, filter pollutants from stormwater, provide pollinator and bird habitat, improve air quality, mitigate extreme heat, and add beauty and walkability to the economic center of Westerly.
